Following Through on Being Refreshed

July 20, 2019 will mark the 50th anniversary of the first steps by man on the surface of the moon; no small feat (please pardon the pun). That monumental achievement was inspired, in part, by a challenge made by President John Kennedy in 1961: "[The United States] should commit itself to achieving the goal, before this decade is out, of landing a man on the Moon and returning him safely to the Earth." I remember watching the live TV broadcast of Neil Armstrong fulfilling that challenge. Mr. Armstrong didn't do this by himself; it is estimated that over 400,000 people participated in placing that first footprint on the Moon.

The front page of the April 2019 issue of the *FCC Uplink* advertised the *Refresh* service that was held last Sunday, April 28th. On that Sunday we received "a challenge to . . . better connect with our neighbors who need and are looking for help from someone about their needs." How important is it that you and I be inspired to take this challenge to heart? Well, just like landing a man on the Moon could not be accomplished by a single individual, it takes everyone in Christ's body, the Church, to effectively share God's love and the Good News of salvation in our community.

Of the 400,000 folks working as a part of the race to the Moon, only 12 men set foot on its surface. When we consider our role in Christ's mission for us, every one of us can be grateful that God has given us a gift to be used. If you need some encouragement to believe this is so, read Romans 12, particularly verse 6, "We have different gifts, according to the grace given us." Committing to reach out to our neighbors is what the Lord asks us to do, because our efforts will have lifesaving and eternal value for them and for us.

Here are some of the items that you can donate that Niños de Mexico has requested. More detailed lists will be available at the Mission of the Month table in the Atrium.

Items for Children: Good shoes and tennis shoes, new undergarments, personal hygiene products, and new kitchen dish towels.

Misc. School Supplies: Mathematical calculators for high school students, board games/card games, ink pens, colored pencils and markers, Elmer's glue, glue sticks, pencils, erasers, paints, play-dough, construction paper, Scotch tape, scissors, sports equipment.

Medical Supplies: Acne creams and medicines for teens, Tylenol, Ibuprofen, Aspirin and other pain/arthritis helps for the Mountain Medical Clinic, anti-fungus cream, first aid cream or ointment, antacid tabs and stomach helps like Mylanta and Pepto-Bismol, band-aids and large bandages and gauze, Steri-strips (3M skin closures).

UNLEASHED - FAQ

(FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS)

WHAT IS UNLEASHED?

Unleashed is our in-house campaign to raise funds to eliminate our mortgage debt.

The <u>total</u> remaining mortgage debt on our church campus is currently 1.4 million dollars. We currently pay \$238,000 annually (\$19,863 monthly) to service a portion of this debt – payable for the next four years. This annual \$238,000 payment is 25% of our church budget.

At the end of this four-year period (August 14, 2022) our mortgage contract requires a balloon payment of \$767,000 for the additional balance owed on this building debt. Our current budget and the rate of our offering contributions does not enable the setting aside of reserve funds against this fast-approaching balloon payment.

CAN I GIVE GIFTS OTHER THAN CASH?

Yes. If you would like to contribute stocks or bonds as your commitment, the church will accept it. The church will immediately transfer the assets to cash. If you desire to make your contribution in real estate or personal property, we prefer you sell these items first and then contribute the proceeds.

WHY IS THIS CALLED "OVER AND ABOVE" GIVING?

Your commitment to the *Unleashed* focus is in addition to your regular tithes and offerings that support the ongoing ministries and mission of FCC.

HOW MUCH SHOULD I GIVE TO THE UNLEASHED CAMPAIGN?

The amount determined is between you the Lord. This is a spiritual journey even as much as it is a campaign to reduce the debt. As you pray and sense God's leadership, you can give any amount you feel compelled to give. All monies designated for *Unleashed* go to debt retirement.

Sacrifice will be required to reach our goal – but nothing is impossible with God.
